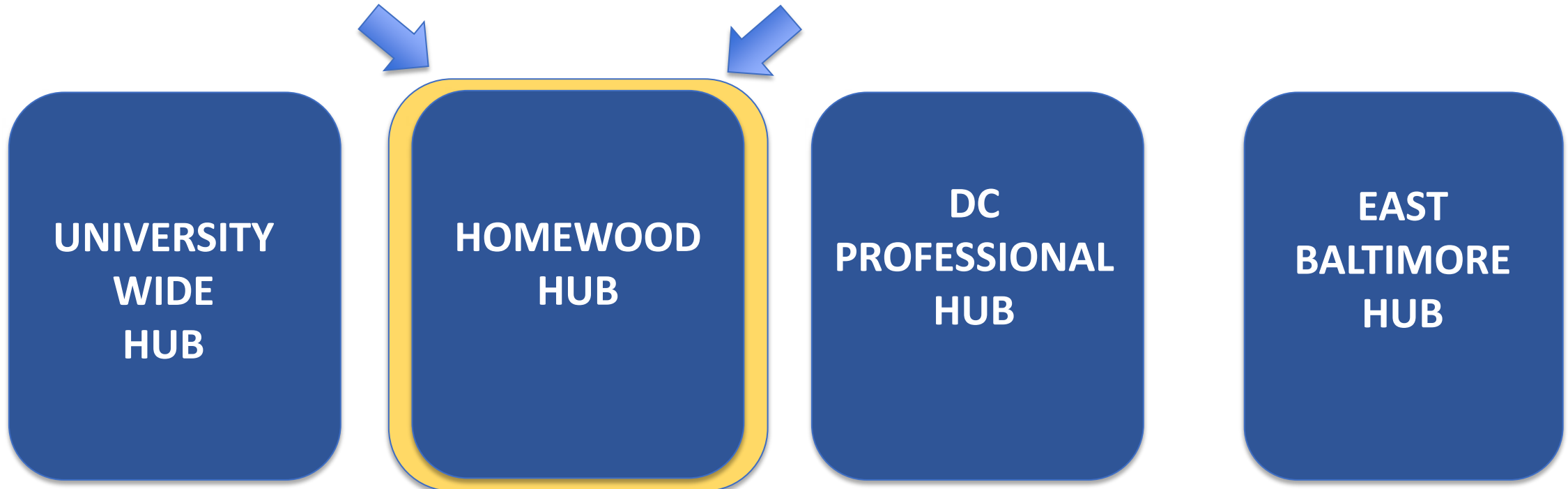
Homewood – Summer Programs Overview

How Do Students Request Accommodations from SDS?

- ▶ New students can begin the process of working with SDS online: [Application form in AIM](#).
- ▶ At the time of request, students indicate their disability or disabilities, request specific accommodations, and upload supporting documentation (guidelines are on SDS website) that indicates how their disability impacts them.
- ▶ SDS staff will meet with the student to determine possible accommodations before issuing accommodation letters.

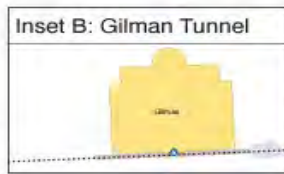
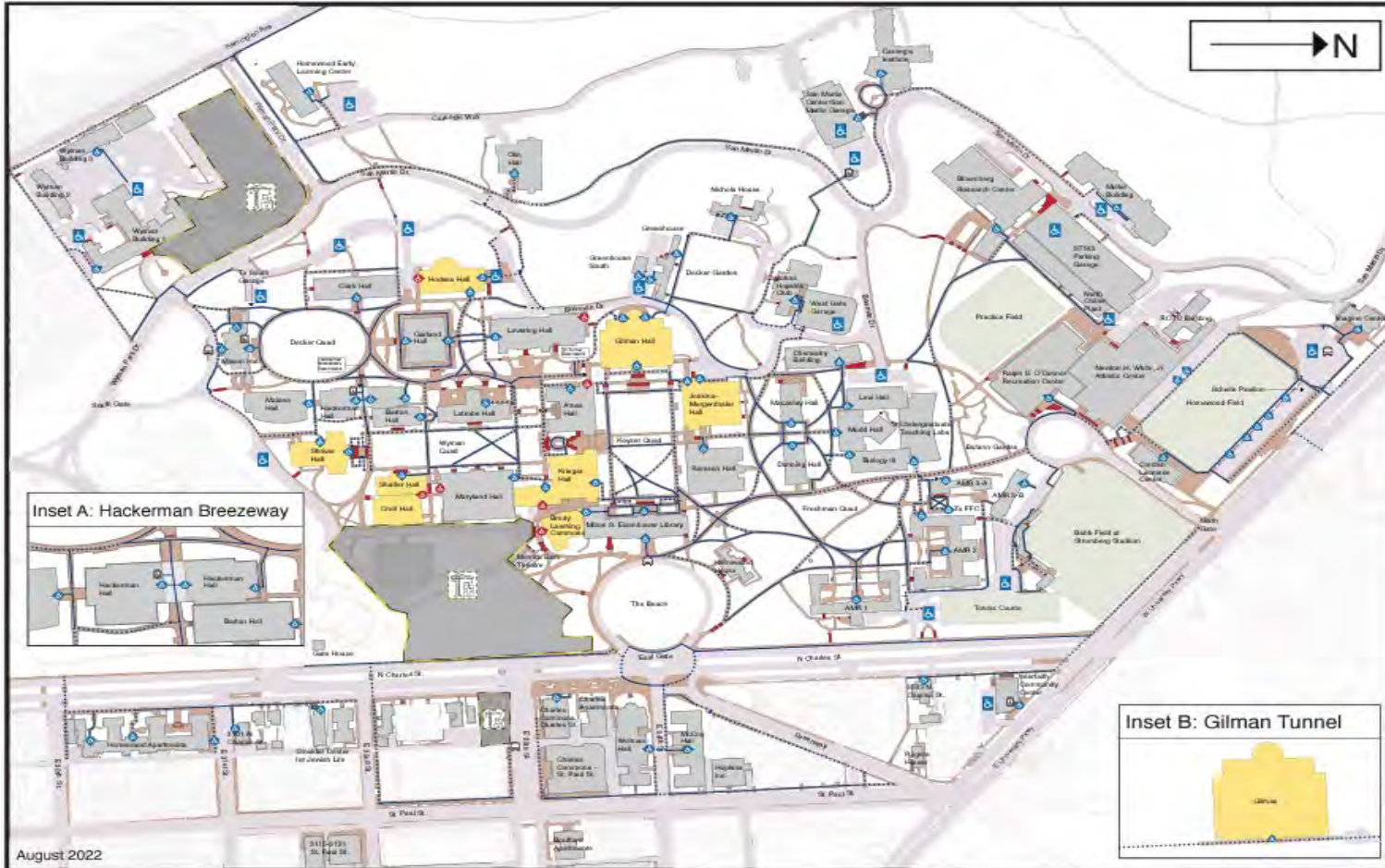
Map Key

-  Accessible Building Entrance
-  Accessible Building Entrance (not located on an accessible route)
-  Accessible parking available
-  ADA compliant pathway*
-  Usable pathway** (no steps and moderately steeper slopes)
-  Shuttle drop-off location***
-  Exterior and/or underground elevator access
-  Construction Zone
-  Use elevator in building to access different levels of campus
-  Stairway
-  Building

* ADA compliant pathway: running slope does not exceed 5% and cross slope does not exceed 2% along travel path.

**Usable pathway: running slope is between 5% and 8% and cross slope is between 2% and 4.5% along travel path.

COVID-19

COVID requirements may change before or during the program

Vaccination

Students are encouraged to have received at least one dose of any FDA or WHO authorized COVID-19 vaccination.

Upload into JHU Vaccine Management System (VMS)

May apply for religious or medical exceptions—do this in the JHU VMS portal



Testing

No pre-arrival testing

No asymptomatic testing

Symptomatic testing required, but not available on campus

All affiliates are **required to isolate while they are sick or experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms.**



Masking

We will follow university masking guidelines. Currently, masks are not required, but faculty can request that students wear masks while in their classroom.

We encourage students to mask while travelling and while in crowded spaces for the week prior to arrival.



Isolation

Students who test positive will isolate in place

Students who test positive should be picked up from campus within 24 hours of the positive test

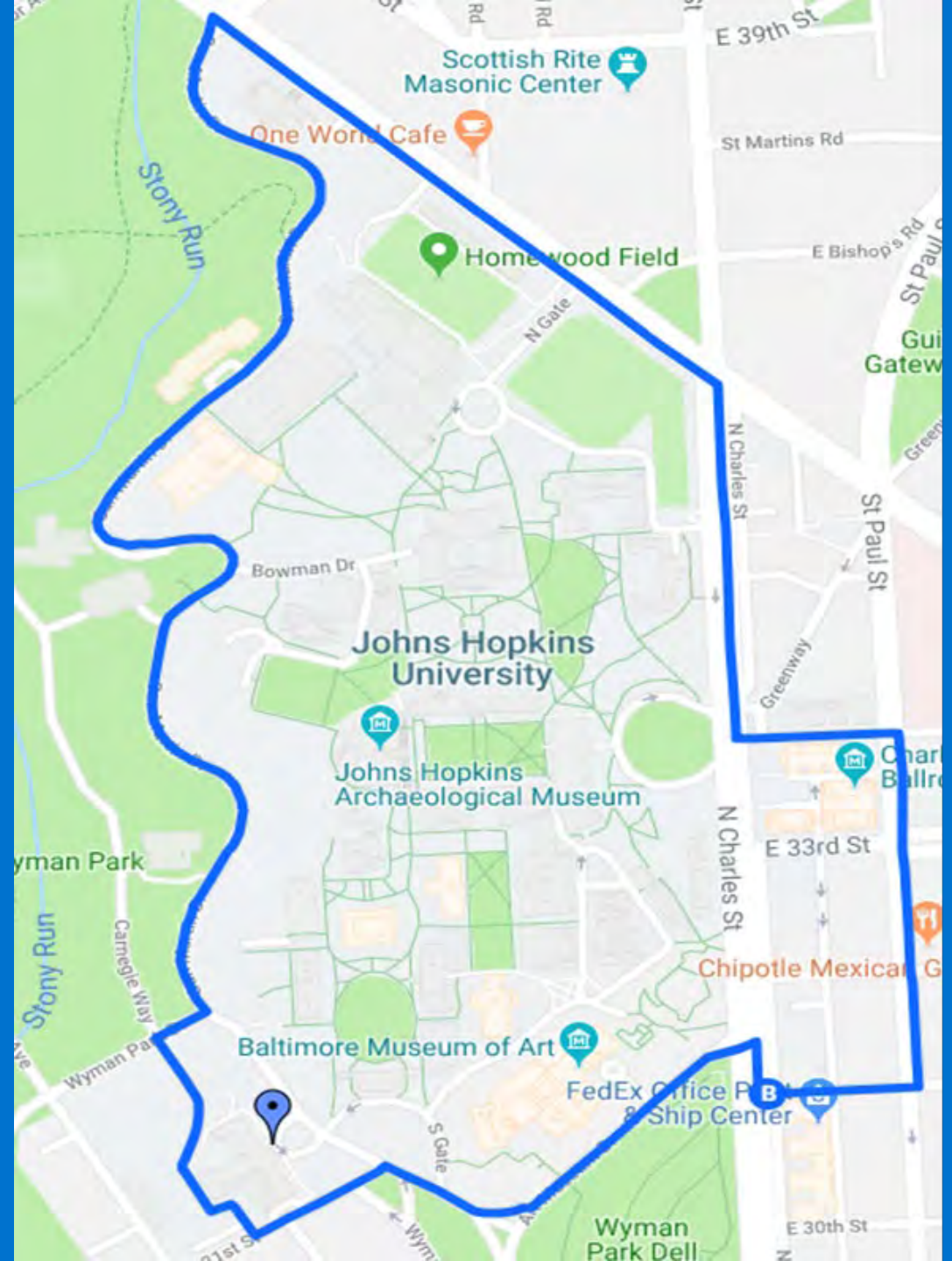
