How Do Students Request Accommodations from SDS?



complete this process as soon as possible

New students can begin the process of working with SDS online by following these steps:

1. Complete the **SDS online application** through our university-wide database, Accommodation Information Manager (AIM).
 - Select "EP – Engineering for Professionals (WSE)" as Primary School
2. Submit documentation after you submit the application.

Documentation is used to support the interactive process of exploring accommodation and services that will remove barriers. Our **Documentation Guidelines** provide information about what is needed to establish eligibility for services, and our **Documentation Form** can be completed by a qualified professional/provider. There is also **link to a web version of the form** that can be printed out.
3. **Schedule an Initial Meeting** to discuss your needs as well as potential accommodations and services.

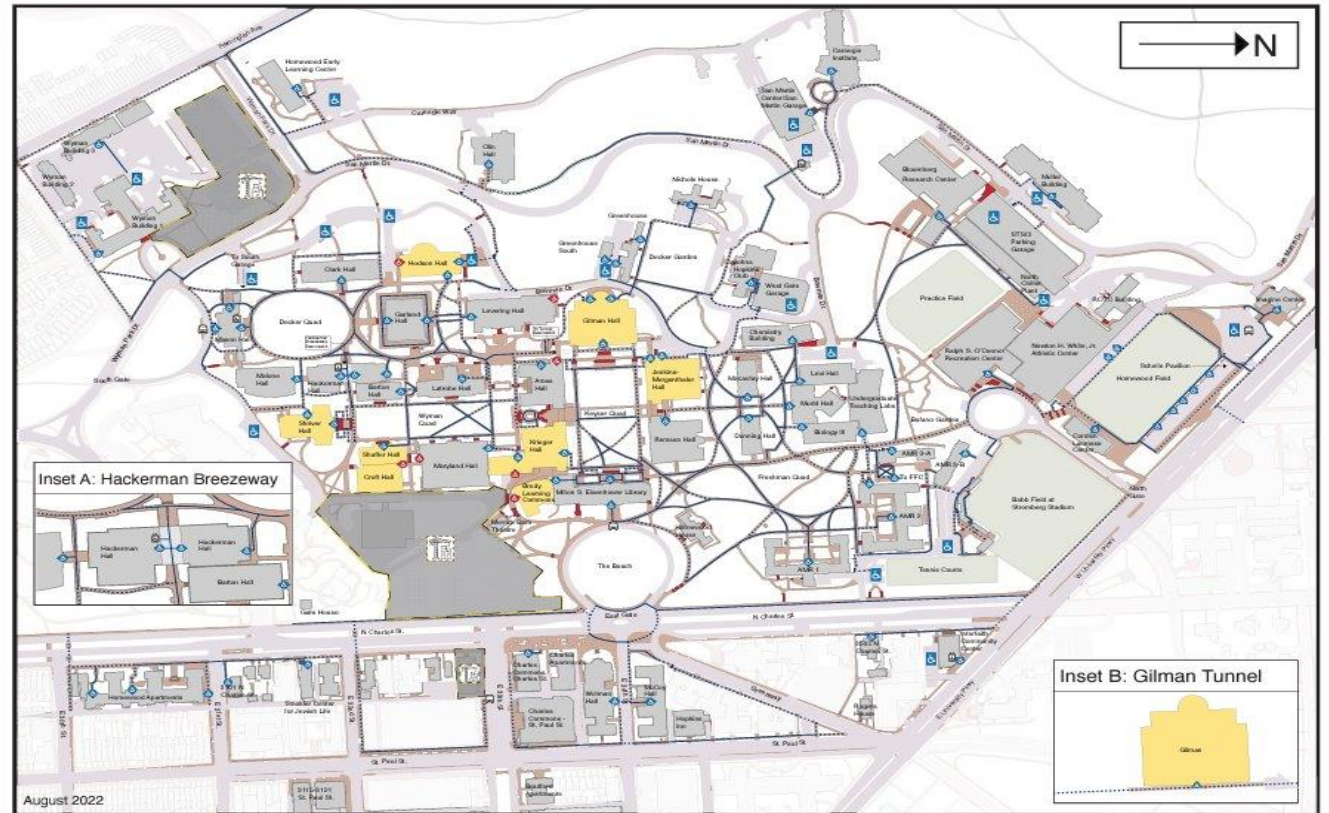
Map Key

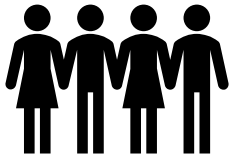

- Referrals to Student Disability Services

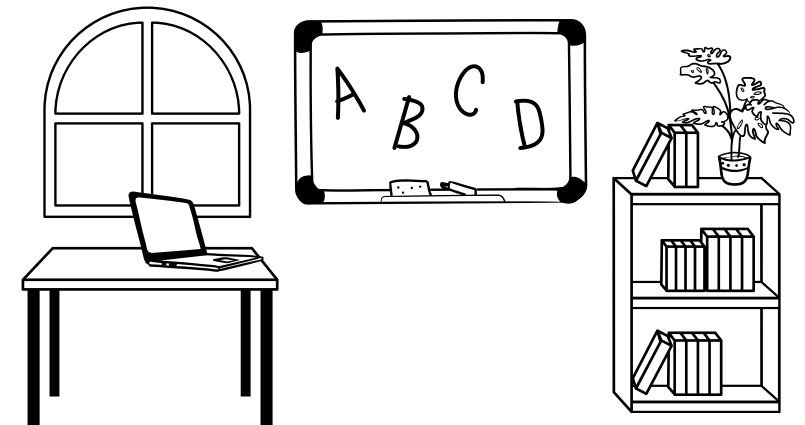

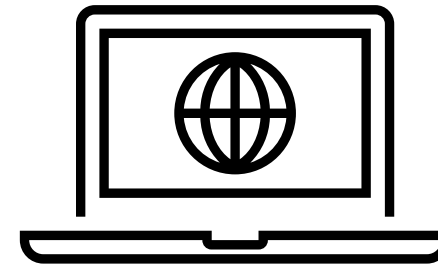


Email

- Johns Hopkins University's student email system is based on Microsoft Outlook.
- To access your Microsoft Outlook email from your smartphone or tablet, we recommend that you download the Microsoft Outlook App. When you are asked for your login information, use your JHED@JH.edu (not@jhu.edu) as the username.
- Can also be accessed through myJH (<https://my.jh.edu/>)
- **Start checking your Hopkins email account regularly as of today!**

Microsoft Teams

International Students Entering in F-1 Status



- Students entering the U.S. in F-1 status must have proper documentation & complete OIS Check-In after arrival
- Prepare Travel Documents for U.S. Customs: Be sure you carry the following documents with you and have them readily available. Do not place these documents in any luggage that will be checked:
 - Valid Passport
 - Valid F-1 visa (Canadian citizens will not have an F-1 visa)
 - Form I-20: Remember to print and sign in ink at the bottom of page 1
 - SEVIS I-901 Payment Receipt
 - JHU Admission Letter
 - Financial Documents

International Students Entering in F-1 Status



- After entry to the U.S. in F-1 status:
 - View and save your I-94
 - Visit: <https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/search/recent-search>
 - Enter details from your passport
 - Click "Continue" and then the "Most Recent I-94" should be visible. Click "Print" then save as PDF.
 - I-94 should show class of admission F-1, correct Arrival/Issued Date and Admit Until Date: D/S
 - Complete OIS Summer Student Check-in IMMEDIATELY after arrival
 - Look for an email titled "Action Required: Mandatory OIS Check-in"
 - Follow the instructions to submit the online form in iHopkins
 - Must provide a copy of your F-1 visa stamp & I-94, as well as a U.S. address
 - Strict deadline: must be completed before program end date
 - Failure to complete check-in is a violation of immigration status!
 - Review and understand F-1 regulations – scan the QR code to learn more

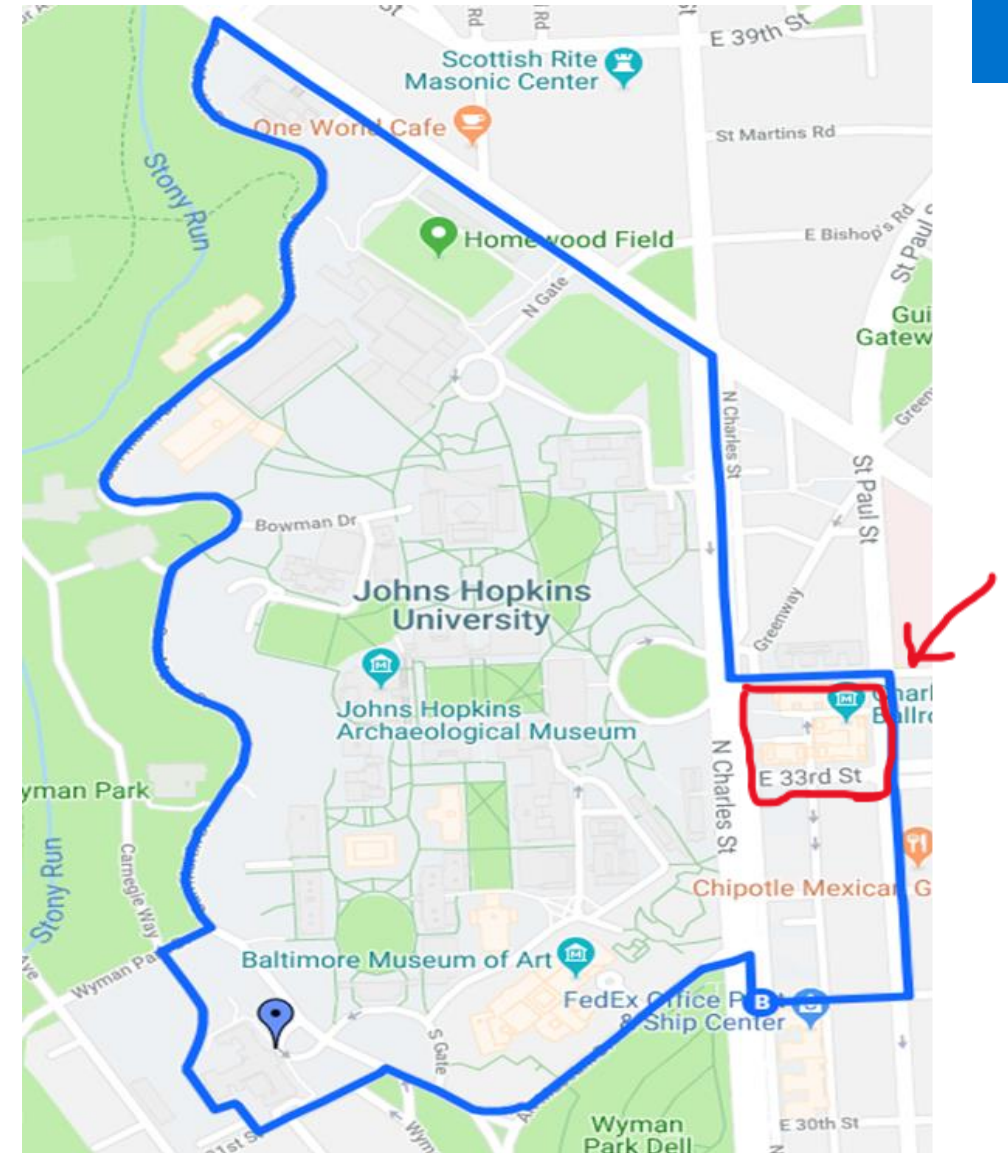

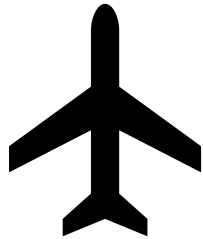
Check-In: Sunday, June 28th

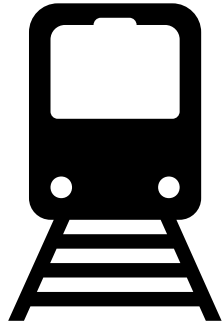


Arriving by Plane

Check-In Process



- Check-in tables will be labeled alphabetically by students' last names. Please line up behind the appropriate table.
- Staff will verify that all required forms have been completed and signed.
- You will receive your J-CARD and lanyard at check-in.
- After checking in, proceed to the Residential Life table to pick up your room key and meal card.
- Parents, families, and guests are not permitted to enter student rooms.
- All family and guests should say good-bye at 4:00 PM as mandatory programming begins at that time.

J-Card



- Photo ID and J-Cash
- Upload photo to SIS for your ID
- If lost – there is a replacement fee
- Loaded with \$30 in J-Cash
 - Photocopying/printing on campus
 - Local vendors
 - Laundry
- Students may add more money to their J-Cards. Spend before you leave as unused funds are not refundable.



Keys / Access Cards



- Lost Key Fee \$125 per occurrence
- Lost Access or Meal Card Fee \$25 each
- When leaving, return key to the Scott-Bates Commons main desk!!
 - For students staying over Friday night, the Key drop off is between 7am and 9am and will be outside Wolman. JHU housing will have a table.

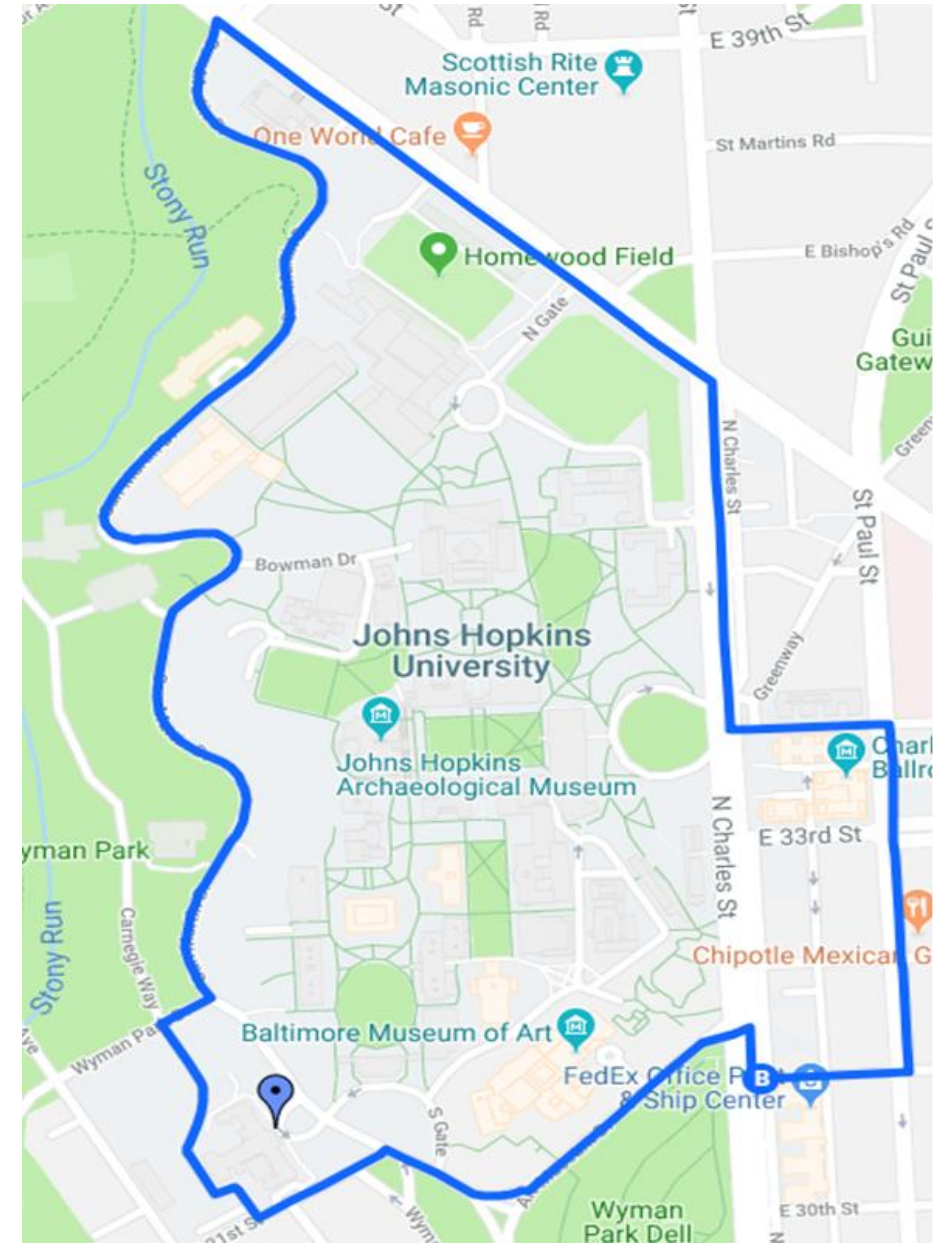

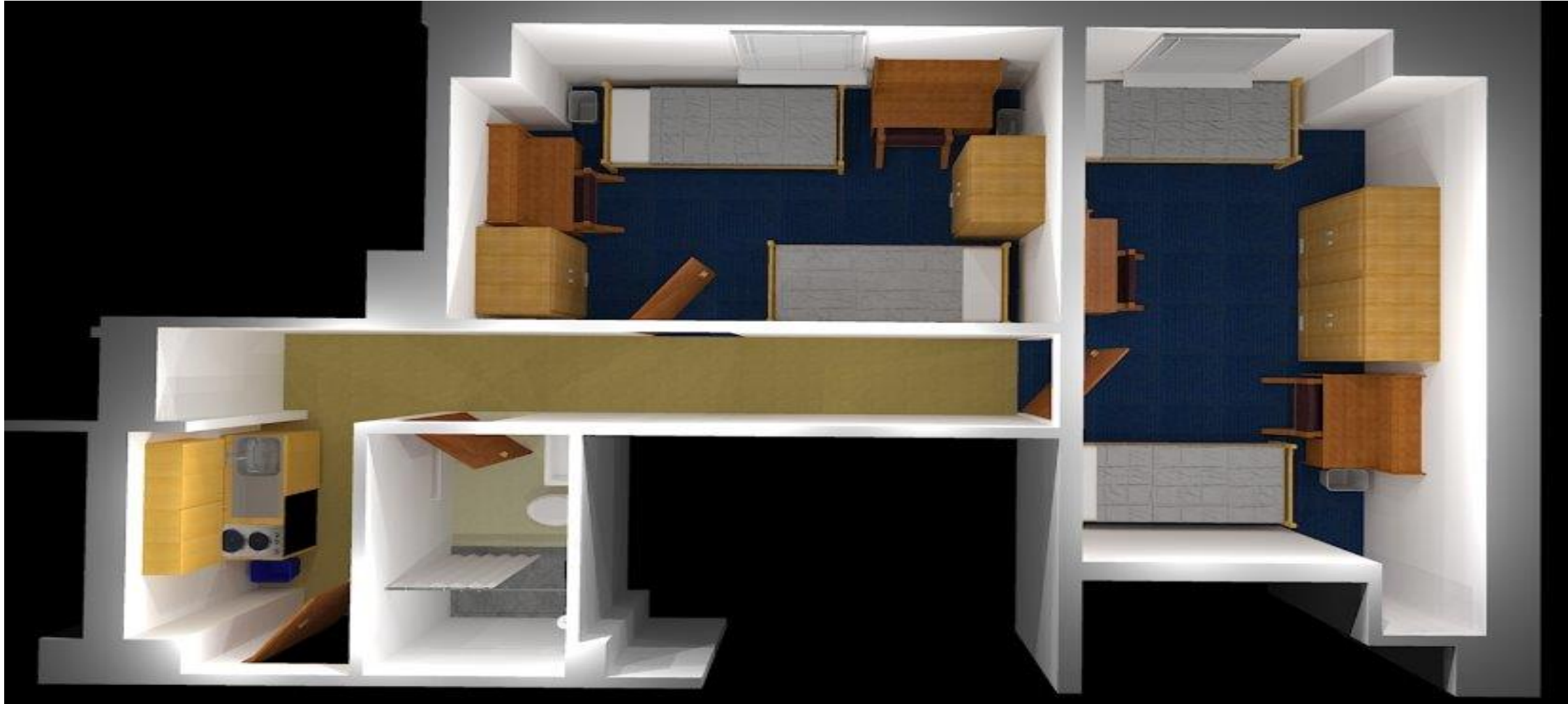
Supervision



- Instructor and Teaching Fellow provide classroom support
- Residential Directors and Residential Coordinators support students during weekends and evenings
- One residential staff member for every 10-12 students
- Students may freely walk the campus home area in **groups of at least three students**

- No use of cooktop within suite
- Wifi and ethernet available
- Laundry – uses J-Cash or App

- In building by 9:00pm; check in 9:00pm – 9:30pm; on floor or wing by 10:30pm; in room by 11:00pm

What to Bring?

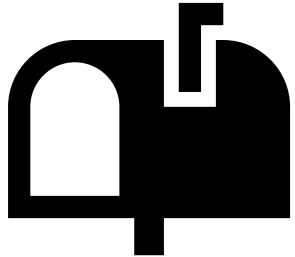


Required

- Government-issued photo identification (ID) and valid travel documents (if traveling by plane or train)
- Your medical insurance card
- Cell phone and charging cord
- Laptop computer and charging cord
- Long pants, long sleeved shirt, and closed toe shoes for lab days
- Sheets and a pillowcase for Twin XL mattress (38 in x 80 in). These are not provided
- Towels and washcloths. These are not provided
- Basic Scientific Calculator
- Notebooks, pens, pencils
- Facemasks and hand sanitizer
- Passport (for international students)
- Prescription medication
- Sunscreen

Suggested

- Shower shoes and necessary toiletries
- Umbrella

Sign Out or Leaving Campus



The Engineering Innovation Pre-College programs are meant to foster an environment of independence and growth. With that notion in mind, we encourage you to focus on your program and your on-campus experience. We encourage FaceTime or Zoom for face-to-face check-ins and daily text updates. Our staff will take great care of each and every student participant.

Only individuals 25 years or older who are pre-approved by the parent/guardian via the official Permission to Leave Campus form submitted may check a student out.

Check-Out Request Process

- A Permission to Leave Campus Form must be completed by the parent/guardian at least 48 hours in advance, specifying the departure and return times. Requests must be approved by either Engineering Innovation or Summer Discovery staff prior to check-out.
- The authorized individual must present a government-issued photo ID when checking the student in/out.
- Check-out and check-in must occur at Wolman Hall, where Summer Discovery staff will verify identification and require signatures from both the authorized individual and the student.
- Failure to adhere to check-out protocols may result in immediate expulsion from the program.
